NEWSLETTER NOTE FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PASTOR

A Personal Note

October often turns our mind's eye to the Reformation, which Lutherans still see as the primary reason for celebration on October 31. That was the day in 1517 when Luther posted his 95 Theses, inviting theological deliberation and discussion, especially in the area of indulgences and penance. He believed that Medieval church practice had confused the people of God about how they were to know that they were forgiven and saved.



One critical aspect of Luther's theology is the "theology of the cross." For Luther, this is theology (teaching about God) that insists the cross of Christ is the only true source of knowledge concerning who God is and how God saves. The contrasting theology is called the "theology of glory," which teaches that human abilities and human reason are important contributors to our salvation. (This was the primary focus of the church of Luther's day.)

Luther often used paradox and contrast to make his points. One of Luther's contrasts is expressed this way: "That person does not deserve to be called a theologian who looks upon the invisible things of God as though they were clearly perceptible in those things that have happened. He deserves to be called a theologian, however, who comprehends the visible and manifest things of God seen through suffering and the cross." No wonder we miss so much of God's work, because we are looking for success and triumph, not suffering – and certainly not an instrument of death, which is what the cross is!

One more brief quote from Luther: "The love of God does not find, but creates, what is pleasing to it. The love of man comes into being through what is pleasing to it." God's love makes us His children – it does not go about seeking to find some man worthy of love, which is the world's way of operating. May our lives always reflect deep understanding of the theology of the cross!

A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR OF SCHOOL MINISTRY

Welcome additions!

This school year we have made several additions that have allowed more students to be able to have the experience of attending a Christian school and hearing the message of Jesus on a daily basis. Late last year we were able to get an additional room licensed for our preschool that allowed us to expand our services.


We moved our preschool director, Gretchen Bugsch, from being a part-time teacher to being a full time director. We hired two new lead teachers; one for a combination of three and four year old children, and one for a three day class for four-year-olds. Between opening up new classrooms and adding new students to our elementary grades we added an additional 40 students for the 2021-2022 academic year. God is good.


We are thankful that God has provided the staff for us to be able to expand our school, but it hasn't been without a struggle. We, like so many others, have had to deal with being short staffed and unexpected changes, not to mention the challenges of navigating Covid and staff being out due to exposure or testing positive. Thankfully we have been able to find enough workers to cover all of the areas and the Lord has kept us safe enough so that we haven't had to close classrooms and switch to virtual learning. God is good.

One of the biggest changes for this year has been with our procedure for dropping off and picking up students. Previously we could use our Portico doors for both drop-off and pick-up for our students, but as we have grown we have had problems with traffic backing up to Nashville Road causing a safety concern for our parents. This year we have split our car line procedures and all preschool families are using the Portico entrance and all elementary families are using the church narthex entrance. This requires extra staff but has eased the pressure of traffic and allows for much better flow. Car line procedures take place daily from 7:30am-8:00am and from 2:30pm-3:00pm so if church members need to drop by church for whatever reason it is advised to avoid these times.

God continues to bless the school ministry and allow it to reach out to children and families with the Good News of Jesus. God is good.

ALL confirmed ladies of the congregation are welcome and encouraged to come and help out !




MITE BOX SUNDAY - OCTOBER 31


2022 TANZANIA MISSION TRIP

We are making plans for a team from the Mid-South District to return to Tanzania, Africa in May of 2022. To communicate to the people of Tanzania the life-changing power of Jesus Christ in a practical and understanding way; to develop them into responsible, productive, successful Christians, and equip them for their ministry in the church and like mission in the world.

We plan to visit the city of Shinyanga, home of the Southeast Lake Victoria Lutheran District.

The main emphasis of the trip will be to share the Good News of Jesus with the Sukuma people, located in Northwest Tanzania. We will also visit other areas of past ministry; such as food ministry to albino children, Mwadui Lutheran secondary school, widows ministry. Team members will go door-to-door in villages to spread the word of God and the wonderful news of Jesus Christ's death and resurrection. The team will be accompanied by local ministers and lay persons who will act as translators. We will be using simple techniques such as: an Evangecube or Bible story telling. 

One way Satan attacks Christians is by reminding us of our sins, both of commission (wrongdoing) and omission (neglecting to do right). And one way we can fight back is by remembering our baptism. The reformer Martin Luther recommended pondering that sacrament daily, whenever we wash our face, because “in baptism sins are drowned.”

Getting dressed can serve as another frequent reminder, Luther says, because baptism is the “daily garment ... the Christian is to wear all the time.” He writes, “Christ instituted holy baptism ... to clothe you with his righteousness. It is tantamount to his saying, ‘My righteousness shall be your righteousness; my innocence, your innocence. Your sins indeed are great, but by baptism I bestow on you my righteousness; I strip death from you and clothe you with my life.’”






