




The Word Became Flesh:

An Advent/Christmas Sermon Series on John 1:1–18

John 1:1–18 introduces one of the Bible's greatest and grandest books—the Gospel according to St. John. These eighteen verses contain some of the most important words written—*ever*. They explode with light and brilliance, truth and grace. And John 1:1–18 is chalked-full of dearly-loved Advent and Christmas themes, with the most famous one being, "The Word became flesh." (John 1:14). That's the focus of this series of sermons on John 1:1–18. The lineup is as follows:

Advent 1: "You Have My Word!" (John 1:1–5)
Advent 2: "A Man Named John" (John 1:6–9, 15)

Advent 3: "Chosen Children" (John 1:12b)

Christmas Eve: "The Word Dwelt Among Us" (John 1:14a)
Christmas Day: "We Have Seen His Glory!" (John 1:14b)
Sunday after Christmas: "Whoever Takes the Son Gets It All"

(Luke 2:1-20)

Historically the Fourth Gospel is likened to an eagle an image suggesting that John soars to awesome heights of glory and grandeur. As we begin Advent and dig deep into John 1:1–18, *get ready to fly!*




